

# Ali group for GGF AA covers Tempcover

The Glass and Glazing Federation (GGF) is pleased to announce the formation of the new GGF aluminium group.

The idea came from the the GGF's technical team, which identified a gap in the current GGF technical group infrastructure.

David Borland, GGF senior technical officer says: "Part of the responsibilities of the technical department is to continually review the service we provide to members and most importantly recognise gaps in that service."

The new aluminium group will attract interest not only from companies in GGF membership but also many companies who are non-members. In 2021, the GGF has seen new members join the federation with a specific interest in the aluminium sector. Borland says: "While there is substantial overlap with the GGF window and door group, there are areas of fenestration that are unique to aluminium such as shopfronts, commercial entrance screens, curtain walling and commercial windows. We hope with the support of a considerable

number of existing GGF members with aluminium interests, the aluminium group can prove to be a valuable technical asset for the GGF, our members and the industry." □
