Each member can nominate a main contact and a stand-in contact for the CAB technical committee, which currently meets three times a year, in the spring, early summer and autumn, writes Phil Slinger

The spring and autumn meetings usually take place on the morning of the CAB spring and autumn members' meeting and at the same location as the members' meeting, making it easier for members to attend both meetings. The third meeting usually takes place in the early summer. The calling notice and draft agenda for each meeting are sent to main contact members of the technical committee (see below) several weeks in advance. For our first CAB technical committee meeting of 2024 it is planned as a stand alone event.

For the individual joining the CAB technical committee, it can be a great way to gain valuable experience, and knowledge, and to contribute to the development of industry standards. CAB technical committee members discuss with other CAB members the practical implementation of the latest relevant standards and regulations. Members have the opportunity to shape future standards and regulations and UK government consultations. Also members have the ability to guide the future direction of the technical committee and to propose agenda items and topics for new publications

From the technical menu of our website members of the technical committee can also access, technical committee information and papers, standards for comment, consultations, special working group information and position papers. By participating in the technical committee, you can help shape the direction of the sector and put forward your company's concerns and views.

The next CAB technical committee meeting is a hybrid meeting, hosted by AluK at Chepstow and online on Thursday 7th March.

One thing we have learnt is that as one door closes, opens. another In residential market we have seen new build cut by one-third in 2023, but this has gone hand in hand with homeowners staying existing properties and refurbishing and extending what they have, often utilising new thermal efficient windows and doors. A similar trend

occurs in commercial offices. Rather than moving or demolishing, building refurbishment occurs when faced with a market downturn.
