# 1.5 Million New Build Homes- We Just Can't See It

Three quarters (72%) of people surveyed believe the Labour Party's pledge of 1.5 million new homes is unachievable. And two thirds believe the prices for any newly built homes are unrealistic.

The survey was conducted by video game publisher Wired Productions and developer Just Add Water, which have created an authentic and immersive light-simulation VR excavator game for the Meta Quest VR headset, DIG VR which is to be used in construction training.

#### No to new

Showing the public's confidence in new build homes, 2 in 5 (40%) said they would rather



buy an existing house than a new build.

When asked why 1.5 million new homes is unachievable, nearly half gave 'an unrealistic time frame' as the reason. However, over a third (34%) don't believe we have enough skilled workers in the UK.

## News Smoking

According to newly released data from the Office for Health Improvement & Disparities, one in five workers in routine, manual and service occupations in England smoke – 2.5 times higher than in any other industry and an 8% increase compared to 10 years ago.

The startling figures reveal that routine and manual employees are falling behind national trends for smoking cessation – particularly in the construction sector.

Smoking prevalence in manual roles means employees are 68% more likely to smoke when compared to the average smoking rate in England. This figure has risen by 3 percentage points since 2022.

The data insights, collated by the Vape Club, highlight the need for equal smoking cessation support for all in society.

Taking a look at the bigger picture, over the past decade,



there has been a notable decline in smoking rates across various professional sectors. Manual labour industries have seen a significant reduction, with smoking prevalence dropping from 30% in 2014 to 20% in 2023, representing a 33% decrease.

However, by comparison, employees across all other industries experienced a larger decline of 37% during the same period, with rates falling from 12.5% to 7.9% on average.

Despite these overall improvements, the data shows that those in manual labour professions continue to have the highest smoking rates at 19.5%, followed closely by the long-term unemployed at 15.3%.

While smoking has decreased across the board, the reduction in manual labour professions, while substantial, continues to lag behind other industries.

The government has set a target of reducing the number of smokers to 5% of adults in England by 2030. To achieve this, encouraging manual workers to use smoking cessation methods will play a key role, says the Vape Club.


